Last month, I toured the northern regions of Italy. I visited the magnificent Villas designed by Palladio in the charming towns of Mira, Dola and Stra, located along the Brenta River, 30 minutes outside of Venice. This rarely visited area holds many gems and worth several days touring.

I stayed at a restored Palladian Villa, now a Relais & Chateau hotel called Villa Franceschi. The Dal Corso family runs a fine hotel and exquisite restaurant. Two of the finest meals I enjoyed were in this area.

Small working class towns have lovely grand piazzas and no tourists. Just south of Milan is Vigevano.

The town is known for its history of shoe making and rice growing. It's most famous attraction is one of the finest Renaissance Piazzas in all of Italy, Piazza Ducale with its baroque Cathedral façade. An elongated rectangle that is almost in the ideal proportions 1:3.
